Description of the organisation

Omnia, the Joint Authority of Education in Espoo Region is a multi-sector education provider that offers young people and adults upper secondary vocational education and training, apprenticeship training, general upper secondary education, youth workshop training, as well as non-formal education courses. Omnia offers different learners of all ages the flexibility to combine study and leisure activities into meaningful entities. Omnia has an important role in developing vocational education and training on regional, national and international level through its wide partner networks.

Omnia's member municipalities are the cities of Espoo, Kauniainen and Kirkkonummi Omnia has c. 40 000 learners and employees 860 professionals to work with the learners.

InnoOmnia is an active regional development centre that provides work life and entrepreneurship services, innovative learning solutions and development projects together with students, teachers and its wide partner networks. InnoOmnia's activities include also Omnia's communication services and international services for students and teachers.

Experience and Expertise of the organization in the project's subject area

In Finland and in Omnia vocational college every young person will have their own unique Individual Learning Pathway which will lead to approved qualifications. Their pathway will be tailored according to their needs, interests and aspirations. In Omnia a student can choose for example a sport-, international or "learning by doing" pathway.

The Learning Pathway will be captured in a Individual Learning Pathway Plan which is a living document that can be updated very simply either online or offline. By completing the Learning Pathway Plan young people develop a whole picture of themselves, their achievements, their goals and aspirations. It also allows individuals to identify and record sources of help, advice and useful information that can be called upon. For the realisation and development of Omnia's sport pathway we cooperate with Metropolitan Sport Academy. There are three main goals: STUDY To help elite athletes with their studies in Secondary and Upper Secondary level as well as in Polytechnic /University level. There is a contact person for athletes in every unit. SPORTTo create better possibilities for daily training during the school day by giving the opportunity to train twice a day with high quality. SUPPORT SERVICES To organize support services that are of first-rate quality, easy to access and reasonably priced.

Contributions that can be provided to the project

Omnia has large national and international networks with VET providers and with many associations as well as with the public bodies (National Board of Education, National Agencies etc.) It is a well-known VET provider and the largest one in Espoo region. Omnia can use of its numerous national and international contacts and networks for the purposes of this project. Close contacts to the National Board of Education which helps to provide visibility and public interest for the project activities. Expertise of solid project experience, language teaching and project administration guarantee a good basis for the project work and for the transnational cooperation.

Networks in Finland: 1. The Faculty of Sport and Health Sciences at the University of Jyväskylä is the only university level institution of sport sciences in Finland. In addition to sport sciences, the subjects which can only be studied at our faculty include the following subjects in health sciences: physiotherapy, gerontology and public health, sports medicine, health education. The Faculty educates, for example, all the physical education teachers and master's-level coaches, gerontologists and physiotherapists in Finland. The combination of subjects related to sports and health in one faculty is unique in our country. The Faculty conducts internationally recognized research on sports, health and their connections, spanning the entire human life cycle. The faculty of Sport and Health Sciences at the University of Jyväskylä may be an associated partner or a subcontracting body in the project.
